FOSTER LEARNING

We believe access to a quality education is the foundation for success for children and youth. We help support the student, teachers, parents and organizations who support our youth.

- 🕒 **EARLY EDUCATION:** Help fund 22 nonprofit early education centers.
- 🕒 **OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME PROGRAMS:** More than 69 programs through 36 nonprofits provide a safe, constructive place outside of school.
- 🕒 **COLLEGE:** 14 funded programs help young people gain access to a secondary degree, trade school or a certificate program.

PROVIDE FOOD AND SHELTER

For many, basic needs aren't so basic. We strive to ensure that people have the critical items and wraparound services that can move them from crisis to stability.

🕒 **FEED:** Provide meals and food to thousands through 23 different nonprofits.

🕒 **SHELTER:** Fund 55 different programs providing support for housing stability.

🕒 **TRANSPORTATION:** Fund 8 different programs to help people get vital transportation.

🕒 **VIOLENCE PREVENTION:** Provide support for survivors of domestic violence through 11 nonprofits and 23 programs.



ESTABLISH FINANCIAL SECURITY

The best way to move an individual or family to self-sufficiency is to help them increase income, build savings and grow assets. This creates stability that is crucial for future success.

🕒 **JOB:** Support 36 programs that help people find meaningful employment.

🕒 **SAVINGS:** Partner with 18 nonprofit and corporate partners to fund IDA programming.

🕒 **FINANCIAL EDUCATION:** Equip thousands with education about finances through 45 programs.

IMPROVE HEALTH

Having access to services, education and healthy lifestyles is critical for health and happiness.

- **HEALTHCARE:** Increase access to healthcare services through 30 nonprofits.
- **CHRONIC HEALTH:** Support individuals through 45 programs that help treat or inform those with cancer, autism, lung disease, Alzheimers, asthma and more.
- **DISABILITY:** 26 nonprofits aid thousands of individuals living with disabilities.
- **SUBSTANCE ABUSE:** 98 programs help treat individuals suffering from mental health and substance abuse.



STRENGTHEN COMMUNITIES

We are all affected by our surroundings and emergencies and disasters we can't control. These can adversely affect how we establish a secure foundation for our future.

- **DISASTER RECOVERY:** 4 partner nonprofits support our community with recovery after floods, fires and other disasters.
- **LEGAL ASSISTANCE:** Ensure legal assistance to those who may not be able to receive it through 9 nonprofits.
- **SENIOR SUPPORTS:** 23 member nonprofits with 46 programs help local seniors through the aging process.
- **RESOURCE CONNECTION:** From rent assistance to food pantries to job training, 153 programs aim to connect individuals to community resources.
